Come and experience the natural beauty and serenity on the nearly 20 miles of Castle Rock Horse Trails. In 1992, the Wisconsin River Power Company-WRPCo opened 2,500 acres of their private land along the Wisconsin River and worked closely with the Castle Rock Trails Club to develop the initial trails. Since that time, the club has taken the responsibility to maintain and develop more trails for hikers, skiers, and horseback riders.

No motorized vehicles such as ATV's or Snowmobiles

are allowed. No overnight camping or fire pits are allowed. Hunting is open to the public; therefore, horseback riding and hiking are strongly discouraged during the deer/gun-hunting season. The state of Wisconsin Dog Leash Law (174.042) is in effect requiring all dogs to be on a leash & under the control of the owner.




